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Regulations Amending the Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations (Bus Seat Belts and Other Amendments)

Freedman Summary:

- Changes will be effective September 1, 2020.
- CMVSS 208 Occupant Protection in Frontal Impacts The new rule will require Type 2 (shoulder and lap) seat belts at all occupant positions in all buses except for school, transit, prison, and perimeter seating buses. A bus is defined as a vehicle having a designated seating capacity of more than 10.
- Side-facing seats must have either a Type 2 or Type 1 (lap) seat belt.
- CMVSS 210 references TSD (Technical Standards Document) 210 Seat Belt Anchorages This section specifies the necessary requirements for seat belts that are optionally installed on school buses. Seat belts must be Type 2.
- CMVSS 222 School Bus Passenger Seating and Crash Protection This section specifies
 if a school bus is equipped with a seat belt assembly at a rear designated seating position
 then it must be a Type 2 seat belt and it must conform to the requirements of TSD 222.
- Also, the following is not a new change in the Canadian regulations, but it is a different requirement from FMVSS. With respect to TSD 207 Anchorage of Seats – the center of gravity load of 20 times the weight of the seat assembly is not required during a CMVSS 210 test for side-facing seats or a passenger seat on a bus.
- It is concluded that Freedman Seating seats, as currently built, comply with all the new CMVSS requirements.
